OUTINGS AND TRIPS

Titanic Exhibition, Melbourne Museum, Tuesday, 26 March

7:39am departure Wendouree arriving at Southern Cross at 9:05 am. Trams #86 & #96 depart Spencer/Bourke Streets every 7 minutes, with both dropping off at Melbourne Museum front entrance. **10:00am booking** for the Titanic display, allowing 1.5–2 hours for casual viewing.

Lunch in Lygon Street; return to the museum for a further look around, then tram back to Southern Cross. **Train departs Southern Cross 4:39pm**, arriving **Wendouree 6:05pm**.

Seppelt Underground Tour, Tuesday, 23 April

The Great Western winery was founded in 1865 by Joseph Best, with the excavation of The Drives commencing in 1868. Joseph Best discovered the ground on the site was made of a rock bed of decomposed granite, an easily dug, yet solid compound. He commissioned local gold miners to tunnel underground cellars to store his wines. These cellars are known to this day as 'The Drives'. Initially consisting of only a 9-metre-deep shaft entry and a single Drive, successive owners of the winery continued to extend the hand dug Drives over a period of 60 years to cellar the extensive collection of famous wines produced at the property and store them at an optimal temperature of 16 degrees. The Drives are a maze of tunnels which stretch under the vast property for an incredible 3kms, being the largest underground cellaring system in Australia and have the capacity to store 3 million bottles of wine! Underground tours have a duration of approx. 1hr 15 mins, and involve a total of 25 stairs, with 1 flight of 4, 1 flight of 9, and a further flight of 10.

Cost is **\$20** concession, with a small wine tasting included. Lunch will at Great Western hotel at the completion of the tour. There are numerous wineries well worth a visit after lunch, prior to our trip home. Come along and make a day of it.

Car pooling would be a great option, as the trip to Great Western is approx. 1hr 30 mins.

Eighteen members enjoyed a sunny day and each other's company. Thank you Val and Allan for the use of the Ski Club rooms.


Jill and Michael will be organising picnics this year. At this stage, we plan to hold three picnics – one in early Spring, one on Australia Day and a third in late Autumn.
